Trail Clean Up 2014

Bishop Grandin Greenway is more than a system of pathways-it's a network of nature areas that includes three retention ponds (Apakway, Eagles Pond and Nature Haven Pond), community gardens and public pathways that link and support human as well a wildlife communities.

Started in 1999, Bishop Grandin Greenway comprises of committed community volunteers interested in re-naturalizing the 4.5 km section of the corridor lying between the Red and Seine River. The Board set the vision of the Greenway by adopting **thematic venues to guide** the development of physical space as well as any programs, projects and events. The 4 thematic venues are **Nature, History, Education and Active Living**.

Inspired by the BGG's goals to "increase awareness, appreciation, and knowledge of the area's natural and historical value" the Board agreed to undertake one of our most ambitious projects to date: the development of **Bittersweet Way**, highlighting the cultural and natural history of south Winnipeg. A community consultation session was held in April to get the communities' feedback on conceptual plans; meetings were held with the City and Hydro for their questions and input, project budget drafted, working group terms of reference developed and ground work was laid for the first phase of the project set to start 2015.

Spring is clean up time on the Greenway. Bishop Grandin has the dubious honor of usually making it on to Take Pride list of worst roads for garbage and 2014 was no different. In addition to the many bags of garbage, volunteers collected scrap metal, car parts, building material, tent parts and even an old couch. The Community Garden is next on the "to do" list, with boxes to be cleaned-up, repaired and ground beds to weeded. Board members Debbie Svaling and Bruce Garner have been instrumental in keeping the gardens in shape and flourishing! Board member Richard Kish undertook an extensive inventory of all signage on the Greenway, listing

Those that were bilingual and flagging those defaced with graffiti.

In 2009 the first weekend in June was proclaimed by Manitoba as International Trails Day with activities events planned all over the province. BGG had its own event that started in 2007 as a walk, over the eight years Trails day became part of International Trails Day and grew to a multi-site interactive set of activities, enjoyed by over a 1000 participants and volunteers.

BGG's **Between 2 Rivers** Trails Day offers a unique set of family of activities inspired of course by our 4 themes e.g. making dream catchers, costumed interpreter from Riel House, urban poling, flying kites, drumming workshop, hawks from the Wildlife Haven, companion gardening for small spaces, composting, to interactive reading tent and fun activities at Kids Korner - we even created our own South St. Vital Bike Loop. Unfortunately with the decision to develop Bittersweet Way came the sad realization that this year will be our last year- at least for now. We needed to focus our attention our new project to ensure that it gets done without too much of strain on our troupe of Board members and volunteers.

It was another productive season in our gardens this past year. We welcomed both returning gardeners and some new faces too. The planting boxes looked spectacular, such wonderful bursts of colour and creative displays of flowers, fruits, vegetables and herbs! We made some headway on some of our ground beds, and plan to continue the work of improving the soil and winning the battle over the weeds! Plans for the upcoming season include bringing in soil to improve the state of the ground beds and to top up the garden boxes in the fall after the harvest. The community gardens are truly becoming a point of interest on the Greenway, and they are becoming a natural gathering place on the trail for both gardeners and other users of the trail. We look forward to another fun and rewarding gardening year
